11 who, I hereby certify, is a respectable and credible person, and who, being duly sworn, declares in relation

12 to the aforesaid claim, as follows: <sup>(6)</sup> That his age is 70 years, that he  
13 has been personally acquainted with the  
14 claimant since about 1850, that for the 5 years  
15 prior to the 1st of September 1861 claimant  
16 with his family consisting of his self  
17 and wife and son, a child of which was  
18 deceased the oldest who at the time of his  
19 enlistment was about 18 or 19 years of age  
20 and was the only one of the children  
21 that could contribute much to the support  
22 of his father's family. That during the 70 years  
23 prior to Sept 17, 1861 the wife of Gerry Pouchat mother  
24 of Louis Pouchat was insane and required  
25 a great part of the time the care and at  
26 the direction of the claimant her husband  
27 That during the year 1859 Louis Pouchat  
28 for whatever pension worked for depo-  
29 nment on his farm, for which he paid  
30 to his father Gerry Pouchat at the rate of  
31 about 50 cents per day. That from March  
32 12, 1861 to August 31, 1861 the soldier worked  
33 for him on his farm for which he paid  
34 12 dollars per month which was nearly  
35 all paid to his father. The contracts for his  
36 work were all made by and with the  
37 consent of his father. During the period here-  
38 before mentioned Gerry Pouchat was not  
39 able to perform the amount of manual  
40 labor of an able bodied man as he  
41 was getting old and broken down  
42 and was disabled
