

DECLARATION FOR ORIGINAL PENSION OF A FATHER

I

STATE OF Ohio, COUNTY OF Franklin

On this 20 day of May, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine personally appeared before me John F. Whitely Deputy Clerk Circuit Court the same being a court of record within and for the county and State aforesaid, George Pouchot aged 66 years, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain the pension provided by Acts of Congress granting pensions to dependent fathers: That he is the father of George Pouchot who is deceased under the name of James Pouchot at Franklin, Ohio on the 6 day of September, A. D. 1861 in the war of The Rebellion who was wounded at the battle of Atlanta

injuries said received August 16th total 1864

D. 18____, who bore at the time of his death the rank of _____ that said son, George Pouchot, left neither widow nor child under sixteen years of age surviving; that the declarant was married to the mother of said son at Franklin, Ohio on the 15th day of July, A. D. 1857 by Geo. W. Whitely; that he was wholly dependent upon said son for support; that the mother of said son died not living on the _____ day of _____, A. D. _____; that there were surviving, at date of said son's death, his brothers and sisters, who were under sixteen years of age, as follows:
